### **Participation**

We, the pakeke of the kura expect all tamariki to participate in all the activities we have planned. All year we have been teaching and talking about consistency of participation in ALL school activities. Some of the tamariki choose to OPT out of some kura activities like kapahaka, waka, certain sports when it pleases them. Which can at times be frustrating especially while we are teaching new waiata, skills etc... as when the child returns back to the activity we have to hold back the rōpū and re teach what they missed out.

We as a collective also often make a decision to hold that child from participating in activities out of kura as we don't think it is fair to send a child that can't participate in kura activities to events or activities OUT of kura. It can be difficult at times to inform whānau of this in that instance as the decision is often at the end of the day.

It is also difficult to send tamariki on an excursion when they haven't attended kura the day before as they have missed out on important information and are unprepared.

Tamariki that have behavior issues at kura are also encouraged to improve their behavior before given the opportunity to go out, and then the kaiako of that haerenga can make the decision to take that child or not.

The tamariki understand and are **very** aware of these expectations, they agree with the decisions made as we do go through a consultation process with all tamariki.
