<u>Maramataka</u>

<u>Wānanga Waka</u>

These are held at the end of each month and at different marae around Te Tai Tokerau. This is available to Year 5 – 8s and many of the kaihoe, students have already started to show commitment. My expectation is that ALL mokopuna that attend wānanga participate in ALL prepared activities. Mā mātou te reo e koke hei tauira mō ngā kaihoe katoa.

We are currently preparing for a HUGE Waitangi next year – Ngātokimatawhaorua in Waitangi and Otaua will be 80 The Whare Runanga at Waitangi will be 80 Mokopuna and Mataatua Puhi will be 30 This will be our first year without Matua Hector.

<u>Mauri Tū</u>

This term Whaea Te Marino will be running a Mauri Tū acceleration programme for Pānui. We have selected a group of 8 students to start off with and can make additions when need be. Whaea Monique will also be running a Te Reo acceleration programme for our students with NO or LITTLE reo from 9 - 12. She will also run an extended programme for our more fluent speakers from 12 – 1pm.

<u>Akomanga Hou</u>

We were very blessed to part of the 9 schools that will be receiving a new classroom. Since then I have contacted Ministry and they have informed us that if things run smoothly we will have our classroom onsite to use at the beginning of Term 1.

I am still waiting to hear about our application for Year 9 - 10, hopefully we will hear back by the end of Term 3.

<u>Kutu Clinic</u>

Whaea Lorraine has offered to run a Kutu Clinic at kura to help whānau that may not have time to clean hair. Permission slips will be sent out this week. If whānau can please support this kaupapa as this will stop the spread of kutu around the kura and should improve attendance and health of our mokopuna.

<u>Te Ranga</u>
